Age Requirements

Ontario Ministry of Education's Child Care and Early Years Act (CCEYA) requirements stipulate that we are not licensed to provide art camp programming for children under the age of 4 years. Parents with children in programs for 4-6 year olds may be asked to provide proof of age for their child. Please be prepared to have date of birth documentation ready, if requested. Children determined to be too young to participate will be removed from the program without the benefit of a refund or credit.

Adult classes are intended for students ages 16+. Students under the age of 16 must receive permission from the Executive Director and course instructor before enrolling.
