Message From The Board Chair

What an exciting year it is has been for DVSA. After a period of closures, restrictions and general uncertainty due to the pandemic, the 2022-23 year demonstrated just how resilient and supportive our artist community can be. 7,968 registrations for the year set an all-new high mark and the enthusiasm shown by the community to re-engage with DVSA for our course offerings, events, exhibitions and outreach initiatives was simply overwhelming. Read on in this report to learn more about what we've been up to.

We are now in the third year of the DVSA Strategic Plan and have seen significant progress across the three priority areas of Planned Growth, Equity and Sustainability. With respect to Planned Growth, as mentioned, it was a record year for registrations – an increase of almost 30% over our previous high in 2018-19. This was due to new programming in a number of areas, including courses at our new offsite location in the Ancaster Memorial Arts Centre, new P.A. Day art camps, expanded pottery options, parent-child class offerings and more. Equity continues to be a focus with all Board, staff and faculty EDI training now completed. We are currently working with key partners across the community to expand our reach and access to programming. Finally, our efforts related to Sustainability include a 10-year Capital Plan which will ensure that DVSA is sustainable well into the future.

DVSA was very pleased to receive approval from the Ministry of Colleges and Universities for a new full time diploma program, "Studio Fine Art and Practice & Theory" beginning this fall. Thank you to Board member, John Bainbridge and to Faculty member, John Wilkinson for their work on making this a reality. This, together with year-over-year planned growth, resulted in the need to rethink the organizational structure of DVSA. Previously, the role of the Executive Director was responsible for both the business and artistic vision of the school. The Board decided it was necessary to add a new role. The Visual Arts Director, reporting to the Executive

Director, will provide leadership for all aspects of DVSA visual arts programming and academic curriculum development, including leadership for and management of faculty members.

The Board was pleased to appoint Kathron Hann as the Executive Director in February. Her business acumen and leadership qualities make her the ideal person to guide the school at this time. We also welcomed Sally McKay, who was hired in July as the Visual Arts Director.

We wish to thank Claire Loughheed, former Executive Director, for her leadership over the last 8 years and wish her success in her future career endeavours.

After three years of virtual meetings, the Board was happy to resume meeting in person. I appreciated all the efforts during the often-difficult times of the past few years and wish to thank members who have completed their term and/or stepped down: Paul Ferguson, Rebecca Lane and Kate Pelton. My sincere thanks for your commitment and dedication to DVSA. The Board is currently working to recruit and welcome new members, including Amy Goldberg who joined in March. Thank you to all the board members who work tirelessly for the betterment of the school.

Thank you's also must go out to the staff team for all they do to ensure the smooth running of the school and to the students and community partners for their ongoing support.

A big thank you to our donors and volunteers who give so generously of their resources of money and/ or time. And lastly, thank you to the faculty who are the heart of the school and make it a community we all love to be part of.

Message from the

Executive Director

As our community turned the corner on the pandemic, it became increasingly apparent the important role art would play in our communities as a part of the recovery across the spectrum. The 2022-23 school year saw our highest course registration levels to date – all made possible by our resilient staff, our knowledgeable and talented faculty and the passion of our students who have a shared connection to the arts, the school and the communities we serve.

We kicked off the year with our Children & Teen Summer Art Camps, which had the school buzzing with excitement and delivered a record number of participants. Summer 2022 also saw the expansion of our summer Adult evening programming to a 9-week term which proved to be immensely popular. Enrollments for the balance of the year were also extremely busy with registrations in each term ahead of prior year levels.



The always exciting Little Black Frame event was truly a special evening brimming with heightened emotions. 160 pieces of original art were up for grabs from our participating artists and the resounding feedback from attendees was it was great to have the event in-person again - bring on the next one! A few months later, our 52nd Annual Art Auction did not disappoint and saw more than 1,500 artworks up on the auction block. Our new online bidding platform kept pace with our enthusiastic bidders as we closed out all items over two days. A huge thank-you to all the participating artists, volunteers and participants who made both of these events a success.

Winterblooms returned to DVSA this year in partnership with the Carnegie Gallery, the Dundas Museum and Archives and Mohawk College. The exhibitions paired art, artifacts, and floral arrangements for amazing displays in each of the locations. Be sure



to look inside this report to see photos from this always popular event.

In Spring, we hosted our annual volunteer award celebration to honour our many supporters who selflessly give their time and efforts and represent the heart and soul of this organization. We were fortunate to be able to combine this event with the opening of our Community Native Garden Project that made for a beautiful afternoon and allowed us to thank the 131 volunteers who supported the school's many programs and events.

This year's outreach initiatives were expansive, with all our programs well attended and received. Our efforts included preparing and distributing 250 Art-in-a-Bag kits to multiple organizations, our Lavendar ceramics program for our 2SLGBTQIA+ communities, numerous art workshops in various underserved and sometimes invisible communities, and our Artists' Connection programs that engage our younger artists and encourage them to find their voices through art. The feedback we received on the impact these programs have in the Hamilton region was deeply rewarding and demonstrated the need for continued support in all our communities.

This year marked Year Two of the school's Strategic Plan. Equity, Planned Growth and Sustainability continue to be the backbone of the strategic direction of the school.

EQUITY:

The school is firmly committed to ensuring our spaces remain welcoming, safe and accessible to all. DVSA supports an environment of respect and inclusiveness, based on the principles of anti-oppression, anti-racism, equity and accessibility. This includes ensuring safer spaces for 2SLGBTQIA+ community members. Equity is at the core of our Strategic Plan and we continue to focus on expanding diversity and inclusion in all areas of the organization from our faculty and staff hiring, our course programming, gallery exhibitions and outreach initiatives.

PLANNED GROWTH:

In partnership with Ancaster Memorial Arts Centre, we expanded DVSA programming to include Ancaster as a location in the Fall of 2022. We successfully ran a limited number of classes and workshops at the Ancaster Memorial Arts Centre facility. On June 29th, DVSA received our long-awaited accreditation from the province, giving us the green light to launch our new Full-time Diploma Studies program this Fall.

SUSTAINABILITY:

As part of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP): Community, Culture and Recreation Stream, we were able to upgrade the lighting and HVAC system in various studios over the year. This increased the accessibility in these spaces for our students as well as reducing our environmental footprint. With



a facility originally built in the 1860s, capital planning and the protection of our most important physical asset is paramount. The team from Roth IAMS supplied us with a comprehensive report, providing the framework for the school's 10-Year Capital Forecast that will impact our operating and fundraising budgets over the next 10 years.

DVSA will be celebrating it's 60th Anniversary next year and as its caretakers, we all have a part to play in ensuring DVSA's relevance and sustainability for the next 60 years. A strong sense of community continues to be the heartbeat of DVSA and with an emphasis on shared conversations and respect, we have put ourselves on firm footing as we look to the future.

The artwork emerging from our classes and workshops continued to impress, with a fine selection on display during our Juried Student Art Show, Little Black Frame Mystery Art Night, Dundas Winterblooms, the Annual Art Auction. We also shared student art on our active social media channels.

Student Work Shines In The Annual Juried Art Show

It's always a highlight to view the creative output of our students. May brought the return of our Annual Juried Student Art Show to the DVSA Gallery with 89 entries, 50 contributing artists and 41 artworks ultimately selected for the exhibition by judges, Melissa Bennett (AGH Curator of Contemporary Art) and Clarence Porter (Instructor and Master Pastelist). Designed to showcase the artistry of our students in a range of mediums and styles, the show was open to any student enrolled in one of our adult classes within the Summer 2022 – Spring 2023 school year. For students, it is an opportunity to submit to a juried show and receive feedback on completed work. Six awards were issued including Jurors' Choice 2D and 3D, 2nd and 3rd places and Honourable Mentions. Kudos to all participants who entered pieces, to our winners and to those whose works were selected for the exhibition. A special thank you also goes out to our hard-working volunteers and jurors for their coordination and curation of the artwork.

Leading The Growth

In February, The Board of
Governors for Dundas Valley
School of Art appointed Kathron
Hann to be the school's new
Executive Director. Kathron will
guide DVSA as it continues to
implement its strategic plan
and address three priorities: a
continued focus on developing a
diverse, inclusive and supportive
environment, increasing access
to visual arts programs through
planned growth, and ensuring the
school's sustainable future.

"When I first stepped into this building more than 5 years ago, I felt a creative energy inside these walls I had never felt before – my fate was sealed," says Kathron. "I am thrilled to be trusted to lead this next phase of growth with this amazing DVSA team."

Formerly the school's Director of Business of Operations, Kathron brings to the role more than 20 years of financial and administrative experience in the Independent School and Not-for-Profit/Charity sector.



To complement the appointment, the school hired Sally McKay in the new position of Visual Arts Director. Sally is responsible for developing and articulating a recognizable artistic vision for DVSA, including the development of our new accredited diploma program and directing the evolution of our part-time visual arts course offerings.

A resident of Hamilton, Sally has a well-established reputation as an artist, curator, art writer and educator. "I'm absolutely thrilled to be joining DVSA," she says. "I'm energized by the new diploma program and all the other fantastic programs and projects underway – there is so much great potential as we move forward."



To Our Volunteers

Our Volunteer Appreciation Event in June was a chance to acknowledge tireless efforts and express our gratitude to the many volunteers who give their time to help the school throughout the year. Over the past 12 months, 131 volunteers worked 1,453 volunteer hours. Special acknowledgement was given to long-time volunteers Jan Czerwinski, Vilma Pazaratz and Kathie Simpson who received Marion Farnan Volunteer Award medallions. All three award recipients are members of the art auction installation crew, helping us to fill the school studios with artwork each year. This year's volunteer event was coupled with the native pollinator garden opening, making for a lovely spring afternoon.



Outreach

Community Art Experience Programs

At the heart of DVSA is our mission to nurture and support creativity in the visual arts for learners of all ages and abilities. Our community outreach programs are built upon two key pillars of the school's strategic plan – Equity and Planned Growth – ensuring our visual art programing meets the needs of Hamilton's diverse communities, is inclusive of and accessible to all residents by removing financial, physical, intellectual or social barriers, and provides a supportive environment for participants to discover their artist within.



Lavender Ceramics

Our Lavender Ceramics sessions continued in the 2022-23 school year. With the support of the UCB Community Health Fund managed King Baudouin Foundation, over 30 2SLGBTQ+ youth had the opportunity to use pottery as a means for self-exploration and to harness their creativity. The workshops also helped the students build a greater support network while receiving mentorship from local queer artists.

Art (and Joy) In A Bag

Started during the pandemic, the "Art in a Bag" program has continued to support the core component of DVSA's mission. The free art kits are shared with community partners who work on the frontlines with Hamilton's new Canadians, refugees, the houseless and shelters for families in crisis. DVSA has distributed 250 kits to 9 local charities and community organizations.

Providing hours of creativity, the kits include a set of art supplies along with a brief project idea guide. Local partners make use of these "joy in a bag" kits – often using them during their own programming sessions or distributing the kits to the families they support.

"We have been approached by a newcomer refugee artist who would like to run an art program for the newcomer youth," says Vinos Haidary of the Afghan Association of Hamilton "This is a perfect opportunity for AAH to start this art program with the help of the donated art kits received from Dundas Valley School of Art."

Partnering For Community Workshops

After a three-year hiatus, DVSA has resumed off-site workshops, providing high-quality arts instruction, for local partners who work with communities who are otherwise unable to access visual art classes.

Through the generous support of the incite Foundation for the Arts and the Dougher Community Fund at the Hamilton Community Foundation, in 2022-23 DVSA facilitated 32 arts workshops for hundreds of community members of all ages.

Making Art Programs Accessible With DVSA Bursaries

Through the generosity of donors, such as BMO Nesbitt Burns Hamilton/Niagara, DVSA is able to offer a number of bursaries for children, youth and adults who, due to financial reasons, would otherwise be unable to attend DVSA classes and workshops. In 2022-23, DVSA offered thirteen bursaries to young artists from across our city with the aim of igniting imaginations, improving problem-solving and observational skills and boosting confidence. The recipients took part in DVSA afterschool classes and our exceptionally popular Children & Teen Summer Camps.

Opening Our Doors For Art

Attendance was through the roof for our free, drop-in family artmaking events open to the public and engaging people of all ages and abilities in artmaking activities. The three Family Art days – October's Hallowbaloo, Fam-a-Jam in February and Mum-entous in May – consisted of up to 10 drop-in art activities, each led by a different instructor and highlighting the diversity of our children's programming available at DVSA. "Hallowbaloo was a great event!" shared one participating parent. "Our kids got to experience new and exciting activities while being guided along by wonderful staff".

February's Fam-a-Jam had the highest number of attendees to date – a whopping 532 participants who together created over 1,530+ art projects.

Created as a thank-you to the healthcare community during the COVID-19 pandemic, our Art to Heart program returned in 2022-23, through a generous grant from the Community Foundation of Canada. The program is designed as an 8-week session of virtual classes and led by a registered art psychotherapist. Open to all healthcare workers, the sessions promote personal well-being, reflection, self-care, and joy.

To date, two sessions have run with over 100 healthcare workers from Hamilton, London, Brantford, Barrie and across Ontario participating.

Established in 2022 through a generous donation in memory of Brenda Evans – a former English and Arts teacher at Parkside High School – the Parkside-Brenda Evans Bursary Fund provides a yearly bursary for children and youth (up to 19 years of age) to attend visual arts classes or workshops at DVSA.

The award is intended for students who show an interest and commitment to the visual arts and demonstrate a financial need. In its inaugural year, DVSA was pleased to award two Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board high school students with bursaries.

Fostering Relationships Through Art

Since October of 2022, DVSA's
Artists' Connection Program has

Program series has expanded to
include five unique art collections
– each with the aim of fostering
a relationship between the visual

with children at a pivotal time in their lives.

The artwork collections feature 10+ original works of art highlighting the unique theme of the collection and a guidebook to provide teachers with a springboard of ideas for classroom activities. Teachers can book one program for a full month, during which time their students are able to curate the collection, share their exhibition with other classes, and learn about the artists and pieces via the accompanying guidebook. There's also the unique opportunity to bring one of the featured artists from the exhibition into the classroom to share their work and artistic process and engage the students in an art making workshop.


Our Full-Time Diploma Program Is A Go!

June brought much welcome news from the Ministry of Colleges and Universities - DVSA has been approved to launch an accredited visual arts diploma program.

Studio Fine Art Practice & Theory is a 3-year full-time program commencing in September 2023 and dedicated to the study and practice of contemporary art within a multidisciplinary environment. Having last offered an accredited diploma program almost 20 years ago, the new program is a welcome return to the school's roots.

The Studio Fine Art Practice & Theory program is designed to provide students with the necessary skills and knowledge to move forward and take advantage of their creativity as a professional artist or in a position related to the visual arts industry. The wideranging curriculum includes studio work in two and three-dimensional studies, film/video and performance – each in a variety of media and processes. It also incorporates elements such as marketing for artists, grant writing, financial management, project planning, exhibition curation and more.

"This is a unique and muchneeded option for visual arts education in our region," says



The new studio art program is open to students of all ages who have successfully completed Grade 12 and demonstrate evidence they may well succeed in the program. Successful graduates will receive a college diploma in Fine Art and Theory.
